President of India Confers Arjuna Award on RDF Alumna Jeevanji Deepthi

Jeevanji Deepthi, an esteemed alumna of the Rural Development Foundation (RDF), has made history once again! She was honoured with the **prestigious Arjuna Award** by **President Droupadi Murmu** at the National Sports Awards Ceremony held in New Delhi on 17 January 2025, in recognition of her exceptional achievements in sports.

Deepthi created history at the **Paris 2024 Paralympics**, becoming the first intellectually challenged Indian athlete to win a Paralympic medal. She secured a **bronze medal in the Women's 400m T20 class**, marking a proud and emotional moment for both India and RDF.

Her remarkable journey doesn't stop there:

- **Bronze medal** in the Women's 400m T20 at the 2024 World Championships held in Kobe, Japan
- **Gold medal** in the Women's 400m T20 at the 4th Asian Para Games held in Hangzhou, China (2023)

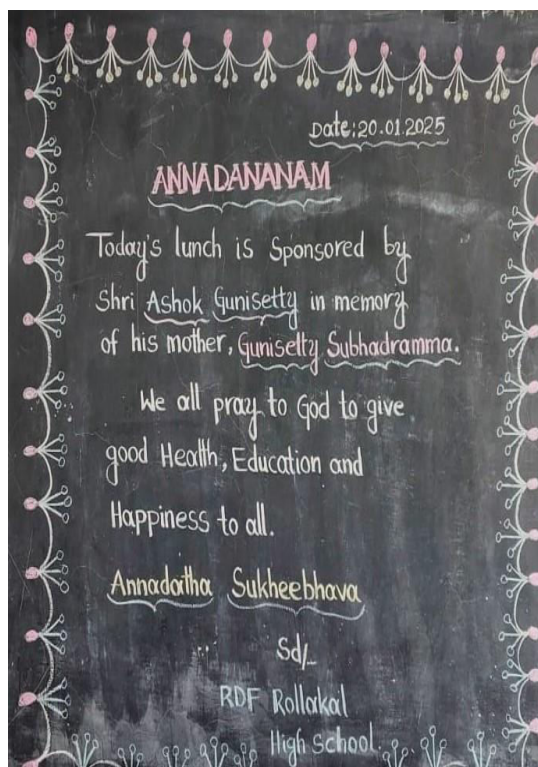
